- All fields, tables excepted, must be completed using “Calibri, size 11” characters, single-spaced. The page margins of this form shall be respected. For tables, table and figure titles and figure legends, please use “Calibri, size 8”
- Proposals missing any section), proposals using a different format or exceeding length limitations of any sections will be rejected without further review.
- Sections in “italics” are instructions and should be deleted.
- Joint proposals consist of two parts:
 1. This pre-proposal form to present the description of the planned work, and
 2. the electronic submission tool to provide individual partner information and financial plans. **Both parts should be completed jointly by all applying consortium partners.** Please consider enough time to fill and edit **both** parts.
- **In case of inconsistency between the information registered in the submission tool (PT-Outline) and the information included in the pre-proposal form, the information registered in the submission tool (PT-Outline) shall prevail.**
- Some funding organisations require the submission of additional documents. Documents required by specific funding organisations (e.g. UK budget proforma) should NOT be included in this template. The additional documents should be addressed to the respective funding organisation directly. Proposals including national documents will be rejected.
- The pre-proposal form must be converted into a single PDF document before being uploaded to the submission website.
- Please note that the information given in the pre-proposal is binding. Thus, any fundamental changes between the pre- and full proposals, e.g. composition of the consortia, objectives of the project, or the budget must be communicated to the Joint Call Secretariat (JCS) and the respective funding organisation with detailed justification.
